




Getting Started -Location




Filling your Container

- Coco Coir
- Perlite
- Pumice
- Other Ingredients

POTTING MIX RECIPES:

- Seedlings & Small Pots
 - 2 parts coco peat
 - 1 part compost
 - ½ part perlite
 - ½ part vermiculite
 - Organic fertilizer
- Raised Beds
 - 5 parts compost
 - 4 parts coco fiber
 - ½ part perlite
 - ½ part vermiculite
 - Organic fertilizer

- Large Containers
 - 1 part coco peat
 - 2 parts compost
 - ½ part perlite
 - ½ part vermiculite
 - Organic fertilizer
- Root Cuttings
 - 1 part coco fiber
 - 1 part perlite

Ongoing Maintenance

- Low Dose Frequent Fertilizing
- Water Completely
- Replenish Soil Periodically

July 15 - August 31

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

Tomato (July 15 - Aug 15)

MONSOON

Oct 15 - Nov 15

FROM SEED

Beets, Carrots, Garlic, Greens, Lettuce, Mustard, Pea, Radish, Turnip, Wheat (December - January)


